SOMETHING DIFFERENT

The Scoop on Superstitions

Black cats, abandoned pennies, and broken mirrors aren't just folklore of misfortune. Most superstitions are rooted in the beliefs and "real-life" happenings of our ancestors. Here's an inside look into these most common fears:

"Bless You"

These two words are more than just a curtesy. Ancient Greeks and Romans believed that if your soul becomes separated from your body, as it does when dreaming, sneezing prevents your soul from re-entering. According to Insider, saying "Bless you" became a defense against wayward souls.

Walking underneath a ladder

The number three holds significance in a number of religious beliefs. In Christianity, the trinity is representative of three beings – the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. When propped open, the ladder makes a triangle, which can represent the trinity. If you walk through ladder, you may be accused of breaking the trinity.

Don't spill the salt!

Look at Judas, the 13th guest in Leonardo da Vinci's "The Last Supper." He spilled the salt, and betrayed Jesus, therefore creating the notion of a correlation between spilled salt and wrongdoings.

DID YOU >...

Leaves change color due to a lack of sunlight, not plummeting temperatures.

The transition of leaves from bright green to burnt orange, soft yellow, and light brown are a part of foliage's natural life cycle. The change in color, however, is often wrongly associated with temperature, when in reality, leaves assume their autumnal hues from shorter days. Fewer hours of sunlight halt leaves' food-making process and trigger the breakdown of chlorophyll, thus breaking down the green pigment and strengthening the visibility of leaves' warmer colors.

CYBER CORNER

Social Security Theft

Just like credit card numbers and driver's license IDs, thieves are after your social security number. Thieves can use your SSN to secure a job, register for benefits, or even sell it to other con artists.

In the event of a breach, the FTC encourages you to report the misuse or apply for a new number. Obtaining a new SSN won't erase the abuse of your previous identification, however. You must take all necessary steps to restore your identity, and if possible, right the wrongs caused by the breach.
