The 30-day campaign raises nationwide awareness about the need for adoptive families for children and youth in the foster care system. Spearheading the initiative are the Children's Bureau and its partners, AdoptUSKids and Child Welfare Information Gateway.

Children's Bureau's newest theme, "Small Steps Open Doors," emphasizes the role small steps play in finding permanency for children in the foster care system. Engaging with young children,
