PROTECTING YOUR CHILD'S IDENTITY AT SCHOOL





Depending on the age of your child, you may not be worried about his or her identity being stolen. However, 1.3 million children are impacted by identity theft or fraud each year (Chappel, 2016), and a recent study indicated that up to 10% of America's youth have potentially been targets of identity theft. As students head back to school at any grade, they will be asked for personally identifiable information, and it may seem harmless. While school officials are trustworthy, the more information is out in the world, the more easily it can be accessed by identity thieves.

Even more so than adults, children's social security numbers are used frequently as a form of identification at schools, doctor's offices, and any number of extracurricular activities. If a child's social security number is easily accessible, it could be targeted by identity thieves. An individual's credit profile begins when the first application is received.

The Department of Homeland Security announced a 19-month extension to the REAL ID enforcement date. Starting May 3, 2023, all air travelers ages 18 and over will be required to present a driver's license or identification card compliant with REAL ID regulations. REAL ID enforcements reduce the possibility for using counterfeit documents to commit fraud. Although the appearance of a REAL ID differs only slightly from a non-compliant identification card, the process by which you obtain the REAL ID is more secure. https://dhs.gov/real-id

Malicious AirDrops

Gone are the days of attaching documents to an e-mail or texting photos to a friend one image at a time. Enhancements in Bluetooth technologies allow you to share virtually any file, anywhere. Apple's popular AirDrop feature is one such improvement, but its convenience comes with a risk for approximately 1.5 billion of its users. To steal PII through AirDrop, hackers need only be close to a victim and have Wi-Fi access. Disable AirDrop whenever you're in public spaces and do not accept file drops from any unknown devices.
