# Your Rights as a Caregiver

As the population of aging Americans increases, so does the demand for caregivers. According to the Center for Disease Control, more than one in five Americans currently provide caregiving duties for elderly loved ones. Navigating the role, especially for those without formal training, can be overwhelming. Caregivers are not alone, however, as legal counsel can help eliminate some of the unknowns behind the legality of caregiving.

First and foremost, caregivers must understand their legal authority. The individual under their care can request that the caregiver become the sole decision maker by establishing powers of attorney or conservatorship. These legal assertions give the caregiver control over decisions related to the elder's finances and health care plans. Establishing a medical power of attorney becomes increasingly important when caregivers must be able to access medical records and insurance matters.

For caregivers who also work full-time, it's important they understand their rights under the Family and Medical Leave Act. Per the FMLA, any employee caring for a parent, spouse or child is guaranteed unpaid, job-protected leave for up to 12 weeks. Contact your Plan Law Firm to learn more about caregiver rights.



Earlier this year, hackers compromised QR codes in heavily trafficked areas like gas stations and public parks to steal money and PII from unsuspecting users. What people thought was an informational QR code about gas discounts or park trails turned out to be a phony site that comprised their data. Scammers are now trying similar tactics with digital Fraudsters barcodes. are posing as utility company agents to coerce customers into making online payments via fake barcodes.
